

THE RISE OF EMERGENCY FUNDING: A CALL TO ACTION



2023 marked a significant year for The Initiative for Gender Equality and Sexual Reproductive Health (IGE-SRH) as it ushered in instances of support for the LBQTI community in Nigeria—particularly in the domain of emergency funding. With over 200 requests spanning essentials like food, school fees, medical bills, and house rent, the need for emergency support has never been more evident. However, despite our best efforts, resources allowed us to extend help to over 50 individuals, underscoring a critical gap between the demand for assistance and the available support.

The surge in requests for emergency funding reflects not just the immediate needs but also the broader socio-economic challenges facing the LBQTI community in Nigeria. Each request tells a story of struggle, resilience, and the quest for a semblance of normalcy in lives often marred by discrimination and exclusion. The stark reality is that while IGE-SRH has made strides in providing lifelines through emergency funding, the capacity to meet the burgeoning demand remains a challenge.

IMPACT 2023

BEING AND BECOMING ADVOCATES (BBA) 2.0

The "Being and Becoming Advocates: SRHR Inclusion Project," supported by HIVOS (Welead), was a transformative 6-month initiative executed in 2023. This project aimed to empower young LBQTI rightsholders in the South-South zone of Nigeria, enabling them to advocate effectively for their own sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR).





ACHIEVEMENTS

The "Being and Becoming Advocates: SRHR Inclusion Project" significantly empowered 30 young LBQTI rightsholders in the South-South zone of Nigeria by enhancing their advocacy skills and SRHR knowledge, increasing their understanding by 80%. The project fostered effective partnerships, notably with International Federation of Female Lawyers (FIDA), amplifying its reach and impact. It also successfully engaged local communities and stakeholders, ensuring buy-in and long-term sustainability of the project outcomes. This initiative has created a supportive environment where LBQTI individuals can confidently advocate for their rights, demonstrating the crucial need for continued advocacy and support programs.






FROM REALITIES TO RIGHTS: LBQTI INCLUSION

The "From Realities to Rights: LBQTI Inclusion" project, supported by HIVOS-Free To Be Me, was initiated in 2022 and concluded in 2023. This significant endeavor aimed to enhance the rights and wellbeing of LBQTI individuals in Nigeria. Throughout its implementation, the project engaged in various activities including training workshops, advocacy visits, and capacity-building sessions, all designed to create a supportive environment where LBQTI individuals could thrive. These initiatives laid a solid foundation for sustained advocacy and capacity building within the community, fostering a more inclusive and equitable society.

In 2023, IGE-SRH furthered this mission by developing a toolkit titled "#Intersectional Tactics #Amplify Impact." This toolkit was designed to assist young LGBTQI activists and organization leaders in refining their communication and advocacy strategies to better support LBQTI-specific SRHR programming. It serves as a practical guide for writing advocacy and communication strategies and includes a review of various tools and campaigns that can be utilized in organizing work. The creation and dissemination of this toolkit marked a significant achievement, providing valuable resources to enhance the effectiveness of advocacy efforts within the LBQTI community.







POWER OF PRIDE NIGERIA NATIONAL COORDINATION MEETING (NCM)





IGE-SRH conducted the 2023 Power of Pride National Coordination Meeting, gathered key stakeholders, grantees, and facilitators to bolster the local LGBTIQ+ Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) through the Power of Pride advocacy program. The meeting's primary objectives included strengthening the advocacy capacity of these organizations, aligning their activities with the program's priorities, and ensuring sustainable impact through strategic planning.

The impact of the meeting was significant, as it facilitated the sharing of ongoing projects and the formulation of comprehensive work plans for 2024. The discussions emphasized the need for core, flexible funding to support intensified advocacy efforts.

The meeting concluded with a focus on future plans, including the intensification of advocacy efforts and the importance of grassroots engagement for sustainable impact.





CAPACITY STRENGTHENING

2023, IGE-SRH significantly enhanced its organizational capacity through targeted training initiatives supported by HIVOS-WELEAD and ISDAO-VOICE. Under HIVOS-WELEAD, a 3-day staff capacity-building training on resource mobilization equipped the team with essential skills for securing and managing resources, which has already fundraising efforts improved and strategic partnerships. Additionally, the ISDAO-VOICE program facilitated a 3-day data analytics training covering data collection, analysis, interpretation, and decision-making. This training, conducted by data analytics experts, included practical exercises to ensure staff proficiency in using data for informed decision-making, thereby enhancing the organization's effectiveness in monitoring and evaluating its programs.











ADVOCACY ENGAGEMENTS







In 2023, the Advocacy Department of IGE-SRH significantly increased its outreach and impact through various strategic visits and collaborations. Compared to just one advocacy visit in 2022, the department conducted six impactful visits this year. These visits included engagements with key stakeholders such as the International Federation of Women Lawyers (FIDA), the Nigerian Police Force (NPF), and the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC). The discussions focused on collaboration in areas such as gender equality, human rights training, and capacity building. Commitments from these stakeholders, such as FIDA's pledge to collaborate on women empowerment projects and NPF's commitment to integrate human rights-sensitive practices, were pivotal outcomes that promise to enhance advocacy efforts and foster a more inclusive environment for LBQTI individuals.

One of the notable achievements was the visit to the Nigerian Police Force, where discussions led to the establishment of a formal partnership aimed at promoting human rights and addressing violations in Akwa-Ibom State. This collaboration is expected to lead to joint initiatives, including training programs, awareness campaigns, and policy advocacy efforts. Additionally, the engagement with NHRC highlighted the importance of policy advocacy, capacity building, and public awareness to protect the rights of sexual minorities. These advocacy efforts have laid solid foundation for future cooperation, significantly advancing the mission of IGE-SRH to ensure that young LBQTI individuals are engaged in meaningful decision-making processes through robust advocacy and strategic partnerships.







PROJECT HIGHLIGHT **IN 2023**





In 2023, the Young and Queering SRHR project,

supported by AMPLIFY CHANGE, significantly enhanced the sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) of young LBQTI individuals. The project conducted an SGBV activity during the 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence. Participants were empowered with the knowledge and strategies needed to lead healthier lives and advocate for their rights.

Under the support of ISDAO-LOVE ALLIANCE, the project also focused on Health/SRHR and Technology for Development. In 2023, IGE-SRH launched a podcast series titled "The Talk No One Talks About." The podcast series created a platform for open dialogue on sexual and reproductive health, contributing to the project's overall goal of empowering young LBQTI individuals through innovative and impactful strategies.














CHALLENGES AND ADAPTATIONS





Despite our successes in 2023, we cannot but mention some of the challenges we faced as an organisation navigating the complexities of advocating and empowering the LBQTI community in Nigeria. Follow us through the challenges we faced this year and the strategic adaptation methods we settled for in order for us to work on our plans and projects.

In addition, we faced a Funding Constraints challenge. In other words, securing sustainable funding remained a constant challenge, impacting the scalability and reach of our programs. The competitive grant landscape required innovative approaches to proposal writing and partnership building which consequently affected our plans and projects towards building a free society. Similarly, for our adaptation measures addressing funding constraints, we diversified our funding sources, exploring new donor segments and engaging with private sector partners. Crowdfunding and social media campaigns also played a pivotal role in mobilising resources.



One of our major challenges is Navigating the Socio-Political Landscape of Nigeria. The socio-political environment in Nigeria posed significant challenges, especially in advocating for LBQTI rights. Legal and societal barriers often hinder our efforts to promote inclusivity and acceptance. However, in adapting to the traditions, we intensified our advocacy efforts, leveraging digital platforms and international partnerships to amplify our voices. Collaborating with global human rights organisations helped us navigate the socio-political constraints more effectively.

Finally, a crucial challenge posed at our 2023 was **Safety and Security**. In a country like Nigeria, implementing our activities safely and securely was a paramount concern, especially in regions where LBQTI individuals face heightened risks. Ensuring the safety of our staff, volunteers, and beneficiaries required continuous vigilance and adaptive measures. In response to safety and security challenges, we implemented robust safety protocols and risk management strategies. This included safety training for staff, secure communication channels, and emergency response plans, hence, enhancing safety protocols.





ENHANCING HEALTH AND SRHR PROGRAMS

We aim to deepen our impact in Health and Sexual and Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR) by expanding our existing programs and introducing innovative initiatives that cater to the nuanced needs of the LBQTI community. This includes increasing accessibility healthcare to services. broadening our outreach on sexual health education, and strengthening partnerships with healthcare providers to ensure LBQTIfriendly services.



ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT THROUGH SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Economic empowerment remains a cornerstone of our efforts. In 2024, we plan to launch new skill development programs and expand our entrepreneurship initiatives, focusing on digital literacy, vocational training, and business mentorship. These programs are designed to equip LBQTI individuals with the tools and skills needed to achieve economic independence and resilience.



ADVANCING TECHNOLOGY FOR ADVOCACY AND SUPPORT

The development of mobile applications and online resources will facilitate easier access to information, support networks, and emergency assistance for LBQTI individuals.



STRENGTHENING ADVOCACY FOR POLICY CHANGE
